**Kelly Westbrooks** received a B.S. in Applied Mathematics from Georgia Tech in 2001 and a Ph.D. in Computer Science from Georgia State in 2009. After earning his Ph.D., he went to work for Life Technologies as a bioinformatics software engineer. In 2011, Dr. Westbrooks started working at Google as a software engineer. At Google, he worked on Google Genomics, a cloud software platform for genomic data analysis. Most recently, he switched to Google's System Infrastructure team, which writes the software that manages Google's data centers.

**Lyman Hurd** is Technical Lead for YouTube's Payment & Reporting team, which manages the distribution of most of the revenue flowing through YouTube. He holds a B.S. in Mathematics from MIT and a Ph.D. in Mathematics from Princeton. Before joining Google, Dr. Hurd was a mathematics professor at Rutgers, Swarthmore, and the University of Maryland. Three out of his four children have attended GSU.
