The U.S. Department of Defense offers **full scholarships** to **undergraduate** and **graduate** students who pursue cyber related fields of study and selected as Cyber Scholars.

Following graduation, students are eligible for full-time employment with the Department of Defense.

BENEFITS:

- Full cost of tuition, fees, books
- Stipend of \$25,000 for undergraduate students and \$30,000 for graduate students.
- Guaranteed employment with a DoD agency upon graduation

WHO CAN APPLY:

- Juniors, Seniors pursuing a bachelor's degree (Sophomore's promoting to a Junior in Fall 2021 are eligible to apply)
- Students in their first or second year of a master's degree
- Students pursuing doctoral degrees

ELGIBILITY:

- Citizen of the United States at the time of application
- Enrolled (or accepted for enrollment) at Georgia State University for the 2021-2022 academic year
- Pursuing a course of study and/or have a declared major in one of the scientific, technical, or managerial disciplines related to cyber or with a concentration in cybersecurity
- Have a 3.2 GPA (undergraduate) or a 3.5 GPA (graduate)
- Agree to work for the DoD, after graduation, as a civilian employee for one calendar year for each academic year for which financial assistance (scholarship) is received
